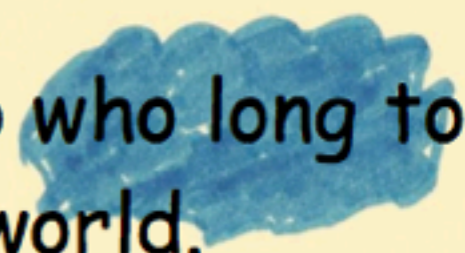
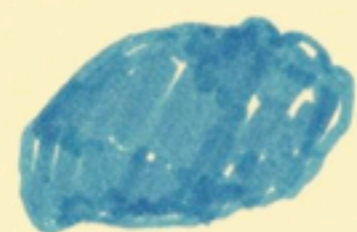


The Lamb, The Sheep Dog and the Wolf.

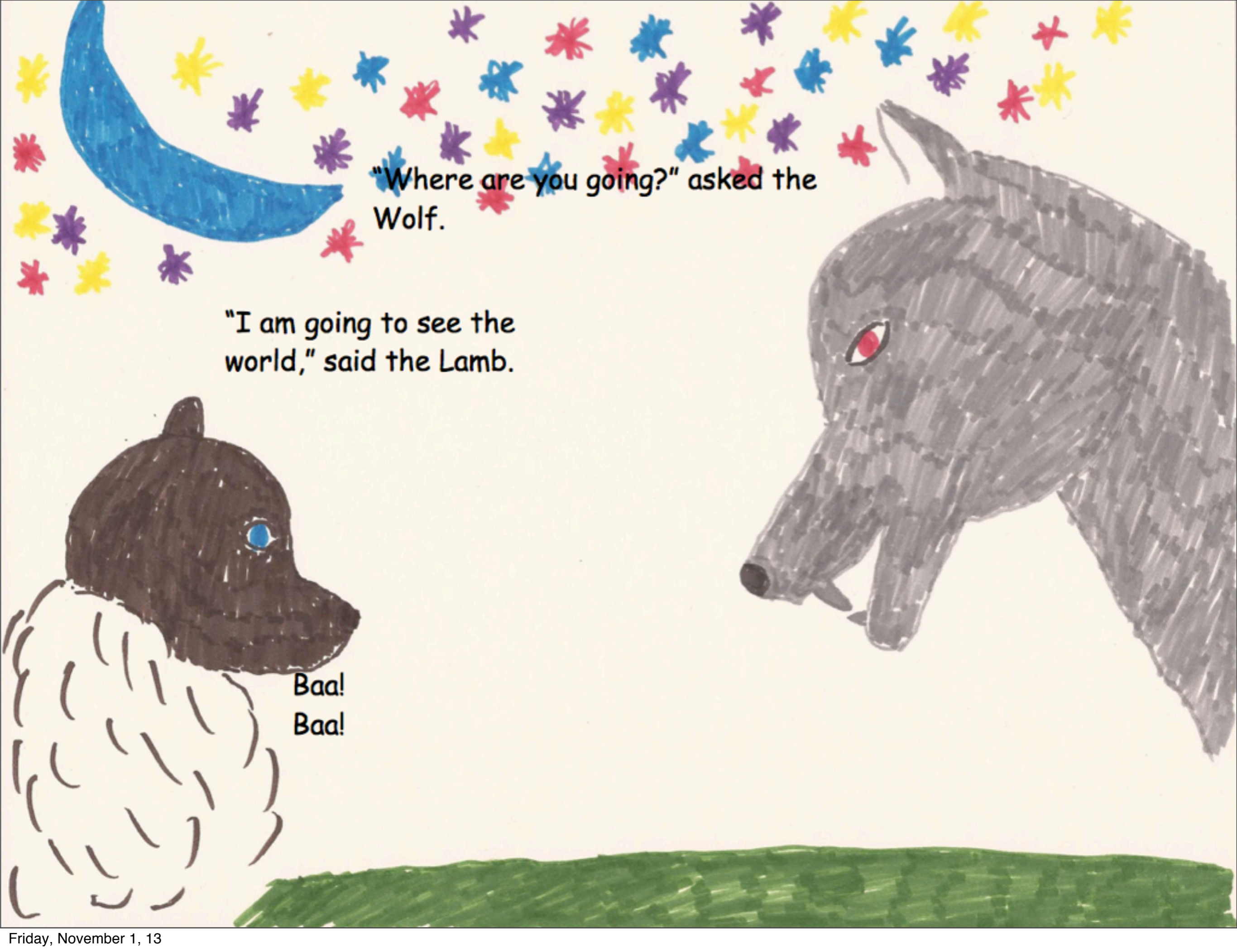
Once there was a little lamb who long to leave the herd and see the world.

"Where are you going?" asked the Wolf.

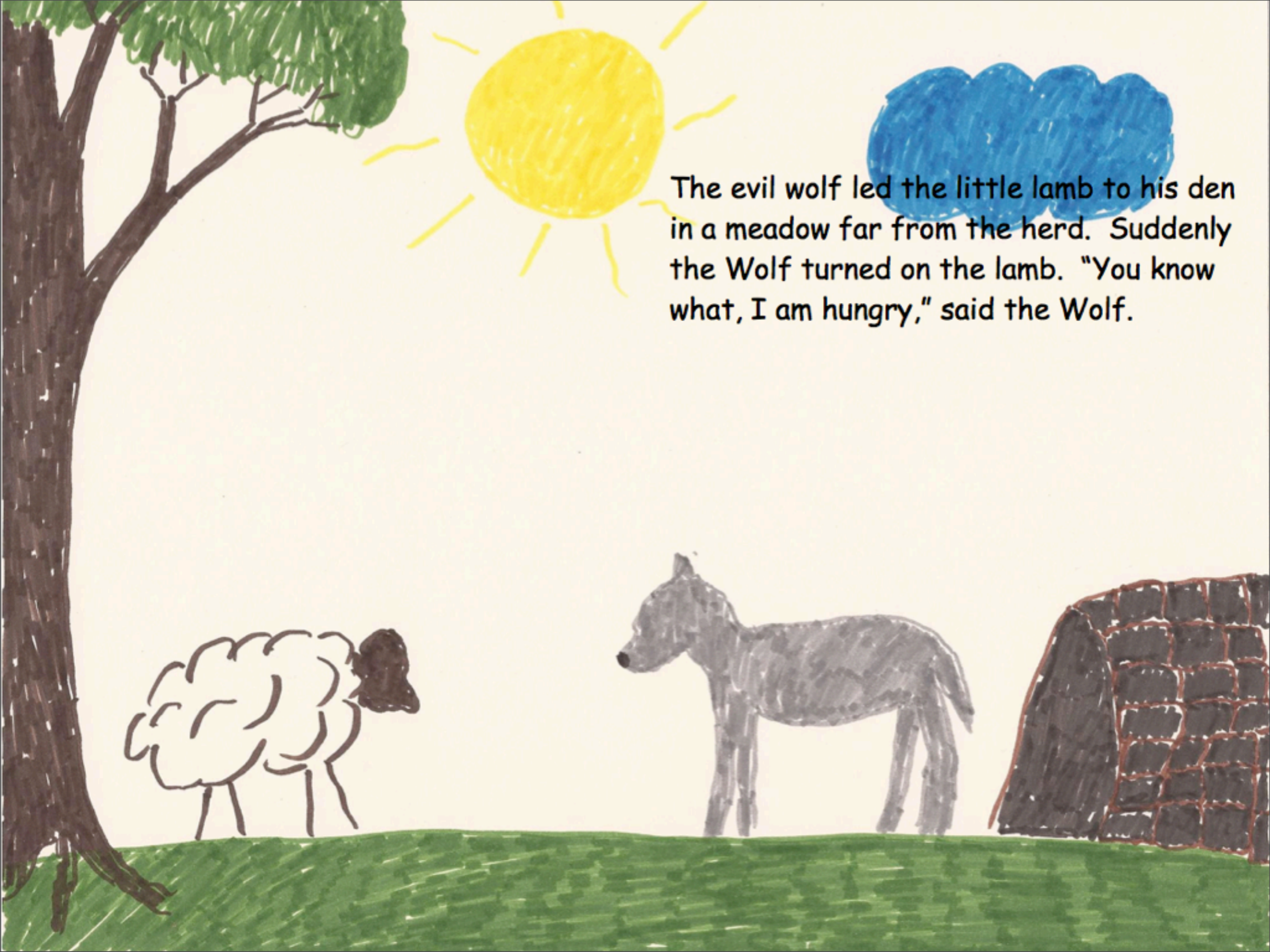
"I am going to see the world," said the Lamb.

The Lambs cry for help brought the giant red sheep dog to it's rescue. The evil Wolf ran away as fast as it could.





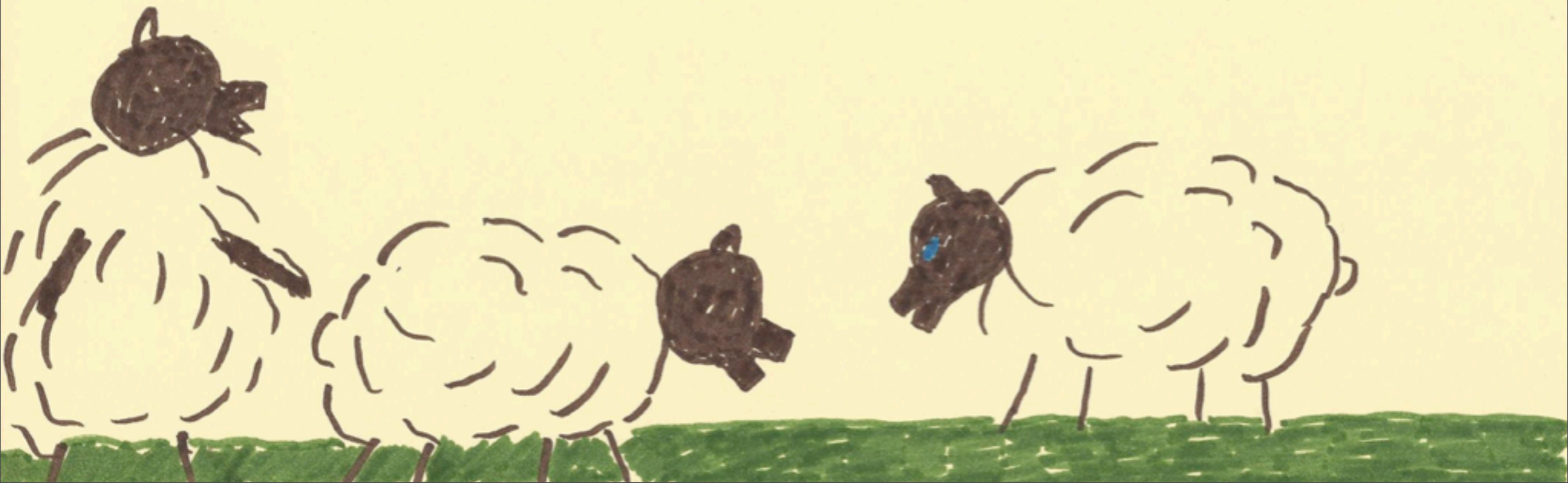
The little Lamb cheered as he turned and headed home.
